VERNACULAR INDIA 2013 Sacred art of the Gond and Bhil tribes

May 2nd - June 9th 2013

Following Jangarh Kalam exhibition in 2012,
VERNACULAR INDIA exhibition unveils certain aspects
of Indian tribal art diversity, questioning their relationship with the sacred: sacred art by the Bhil from
almost forgotten rituals; consacred art by Gond
artists gaining international recognition. Anders hus
Gallery aims to promote contemporary artists who
contribute to artistic movements in India today: Dhurga
Bai, Venkat Singh Shyam, Nankusia Shyam, Gareeba
Singh Tekam, Pema Fatya, Ladoo Bai et Bhuri Bai.

Through these paintings, India's complex and modern identity is called into question. Even the terms used to describe this art deal with a more or less ethnocentric view of the viewer: vernacular art, tribal art, adivasi art (those who were there first), non metropolitan art.

The Bhil and Gond artists paint by necessity, but quite naturally, almost by instinct. Their work is full of exhuberence, joy and subtelty, sometimes nostalgia, with constant references to mysteries and traditions. These powerfull influences, however, in no way diminish from the technical quality of the paintings, whose vibrations remind us of Australian aboriginal work.
